Some definitions:

Gypsies and Travellers are defined in Circular 01/2006 as "persons of nomadic habit of life whatever their race or origin". This includes English Gypsies and Irish Travellers, but also any other groups who have a nomadic way of life, irrespective of race or origin.

Travelling Showpeople are defined in Circular 04/2007 as "members of a group organised for the purposes of holding fairs circuses or shows". Although their work is of a mobile nature, showpeople nevertheless require secure, permanent bases for the storage of their equipment and more particularly for residential purposes.

A pitch is an area of land where a Gypsy or Traveller household can reside – typically this may contain an amenity building, parking space and one or more caravans with sufficient space to enable the easy manoeuvrability of caravans up to 20 metres in length.

A plot means an area of land where a Travelling Showpeople household can reside, usually combining a residential use (caravans) with commercial use (storage and maintenance of equipment). Plots may be subdivided to allow for these two distinctive uses.

A *site* may contain a number of plots/pitches.
