What is the Dorset Award Plus?

This award is available to any young person in school year 9 and above in Dorset. The planned activity to achieve this award needs to run for a minimum of twenty hours.

How does a young person gain the award?

Young people work with a youth worker to identify the learning outcomes they want to achieve. These could include learning a new skill, personal development goals, team working skills or problem solving skills. The youth worker and the young person put together evidence to support their achievements made using this booklet

Achieving the award

The decision on whether the young person achieves the Award is made by their youth worker and verified independently by another worker, this could be another youth worker, a worker from another organisation or one of the youth work training team. The young person will be required to share their achievements with this independent youth worker.

The Dorset Award Plus applications are sent to Dorset Council Learning and Development for final approval.

This booklet is for recording the 20 hours of activity to achieve the Dorset Award Plus. You need to include:

1. A description of the activities
2. A detailed account of how you have spent your time such as, planning, participating in the activity and evaluation
3. Evidence of some supporting evidence such as photographs, CD/DVD, artwork
4. Feedback from your youth worker confirming your achievements
5. Confirmation from another worker to verify your award
